NOTE ON THE PUBLICATION OF RESULTS FOR THE POPULATION AGED 15 YEARS AND OLDER

The international labor force survey recommendations issued by the International Labor Organization (ILO) provide that countries should seek to disseminate the results of such surveys to the working-age population, preferably as set out in national legislation. In compliance with this recommendation and given the recent amendment to the Political Constitution of the United Mexican States, which raised the minimum legal working age from 14 to 15 years, INEGI presents the results of the National Survey of Occupation and Employment (ENOE), from the fourth quarter of 2014, for the universe of the population aged 15 years and over.

The strategy followed is as follows:

- For the fourth quarter of 2014, all products that constitute the normal offer of the survey are generated for the population aged 15 years and over, and it will be done in the same way for the quarters to come.
- In order to provide users with a more extensive series of information, the following products are updated for the rest of the quarters covered by the ENOE (first quarter of 2005 to third quarter of 2014):
 - Strategic indicators of occupation and employment.
 - Indicators of labor informality.
 - Interactive consultation of strategic indicators (Infolaboral).
 - Series unified with ENOE criteria.
 - Economic Information Bank (EIB).
 - INEGI's Information Bank (BIINEGI).
 - Interactive data consultation. This product will be updated in two stages: on February 12, data will be incorporated from the first quarter of 2010 to the third of 2014, and a few days later, the quarters of 2005 to 2009 will be added.
- Products whose series will not be updated, are the following:
 - Basic tabular data.
 - Gender indicators.
 - Tests of statistical significance.
 - Tabular data by sector of economic activity.
 - Problems of occupation and access to employment.

It is important to note that the ENOE data series referring to the population aged 14 years and over will be kept available on the INEGI website, since even before the constitutional reform, this was the minimum legal age to work. These series cover until the third quarter of 2014.
