

Alberto Cavallo is the Cecil and Ida Green Career Development Assistant Professor of Applied Economics at the MIT Sloan School of Management, and a Faculty Research Fellow at the National Bureau of Economic Research.

His research focuses on the micro-level behavior of prices and its implications for macroeconomic models and policies. His empirical work is based on the use of daily data collected from hundreds of online retailers around the world. He co-founded the Billion Prices Project at MIT, an academic initiative that pioneered the use of online data to conduct research on high-frequency price dynamics and inflation measurement. He is also a co-founder of Dineromail, the first online-payments company in Latin America, and PriceStats, the leading global provider of inflation statistics.

He received a B.S. from Universidad de San Andres in Argentina in 2000, an MBA from MIT Sloan in 2005 and a Ph.D. from Harvard University in 2010.
